Why did Levi not really want to hear what happened during Mass? What was the only thing that mattered to Levi?


What competition were the Bent Rays preparing for? Why did it matter to them?

How did Mateo feel about Blake? Explain why he felt that way.

Why did Mateo respect Ozzie? What rumor did he not believe about Ozzie? Why was Mateo surprised when Ozzie approached him? What good news did Ozzie offer Mateo?

Reflections

Mateo reflected on the night that he warned Zonta about Carlos's plan to hurt her at the party. But why did Mateo feel badly about that night? Do you think he was right to feel that way? Explain.

When Lilly finally arrived in class, Mateo stated: *The relief on Ms. Williams's face was added proof that Lilly seemed to get away with things that the rest of us didn't.* What did he mean by *get away with things,* and do you agree with Mateo? Discuss.

Chapter 6 The Gig

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

cover songs—a song originally written and performed by one artist or music group but is performed by a different artist or music group

pegged—named/called/declared/decided on

to market yourself—to get one's name/brand/team/group out to the public

Questions

Mateo had not believed the rumor that Ozzie had tried to take his own life. What happened that made him think that the rumor may have had some truth to it?

Why did Mateo think he had messed up the chance at booking the gig? Why did Ms. Waxman still want to consider the Bent Rays for the wedding gig?

Reflections

How did Mateo handle stress? Where do you think Mateo went wrong?

Do you agree with Mrs. Waxman that the band really needed to figure out how to market themselves? Explain.

Chapter 7 Rivers

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

conducting—in music, it is the leading or directing, when the person who stands in front of the musicians guides them

Questions

Why did Mateo eat lunch every day with Rivers in the chorus room?

What did Rivers say that caused Mateo to have a hard time eating? Why did this news surprise Mateo?

Chapter 8 The Deal

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

lead vocalist—the main singer

lyrics—a song's words

sound board—a board that takes in the sounds from the instruments and the microphones during a concert, and the individuals who operate it can adjust levels as needed

Questions

Why did Rivers think that Bent Rays was not ready to compete?

What deal did Rivers and Mateo agree to?

Reflection

When Rivers and Mateo discuss Mateo's problem with closing his eyes, Rivers stated: It's like you close your eyes and shut out the world. But when Mateo reflected on the issue, he stated: I still needed to work on opening my eyes. When I did open my eyes, it was always to check on something, never because I wanted to connect with my audience. Even at church. But still, that shouldn't be enough to keep us from competing. Who do you think had a better understanding of why Mateo keeps his eyes closed? Discuss what you think is going on with Mateo's habit of closing his eyes when he sings.

Check out how these words are used in context:

long shot—not likely, little chance
mimicked—copied

Questions

What did Mateo admit the earbuds helped him block out?

What did Mateo need from Emma, and why was his request a long shot?

What deal do Mateo and Emma make?

Reflections

Mateo stated the following about Blake: Blake always seemed to have a little fear of me, and I planned to keep it that way. Why do you think Mateo still acted this way towards Blake?

After Emma and Mateo made the deal, Mateo pointed out: "... one day, we'll run out of deals that need to be made." Then Emma responds: "Are you really worried that we can't be friends without a trade-off between us?" Mateo said they were not friends. Why did he keep pushing the friends-idea away?

Chapter 10 Gavin

Questions

Who did Mateo run into in the lunchroom? What happened with Alma that surprised Mateo? Why was it such a surprise to him?

What things did Gavin do or say that really bothered Mateo?

Reflection

Why did Mateo not push it with Gavin? What made him back off and move on? Do you think Mateo overreacted (made a bigger deal out of it) to begin with? Discuss.

Chapter 11 Dents

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

chew out—yell at
sorry—poor/bad/pitiful

Questions

What joke did Levi play on Mateo and Omar as they waited in the Bent Rays' van outside of Tang-Lee fabrics?

Why was the joke not funny to either Mateo or Officer Evans?

What did Officer Evans promise he would do to make it up to Mateo and Omar?

Reflection

Do you think Mateo and Omar had good reason to be upset with Levi for this joke? What do you think Levi was thinking when he planned the joke? Do you think he had any idea what he was doing? Explain.

Chapter 12 Tang-Lee Fabrics

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

brocade fabric—a woven fabric with a pattern that can look metallic or shiny. Often this type of fabric is used for decorative reasons or for costumes.

plaids—checkered patterns

sick—1. awful 2. awesome/cool

trench-coat—a long jacket that almost reaches the ground or floor

upholstery—the material used to cover furniture like chairs and couches

Question

What did Mateo decide to change about the fabric choice for their jackets? Why?

Reflections

What did Emma's behavior towards Omar when she arrived at the fabric store tell you about Emma?

How do you think Levi and Theo will react when they see the fabric choices Mateo made?

Chapter 13 Too Far

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

radical—cool/excellent/extreme in a good way

Questions

How did Levi and Theo respond differently to the new idea for their rock-band jackets?

What worried Mateo about Levi's response?

Reflection

Why did Mateo suddenly wonder if he had pushed it too far? Do you think his worry was valid (he had a good reason to feel that way)? Explain.

Chapter 14 Hancock Burger

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

hip—in style
linoleum—type of flooring made out of natural materials
retro—styles related to the past
vinyl—a synthetic/artificial material, a type of plastic

Questions

Where did Mateo work, and why did he love working there?

What did Gavin say that bothered Mateo? How did he handle it?

Reflections

June Figby, Mateo's boss, told Mateo: "You'd think things make more sense when you get older. But that's only half the truth. Bottom line is you just stop focusing on what doesn't make sense and move on with life." How did this statement help Mateo? Do you think there could be some truth to June's statement? Discuss.

Why do you think Lilly was at Hancock Burger?

Chapter 15 Shift

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context: shift—time working on a job

Questions

What was Lilly doing at Hancock Burger?

What two things did June tell Lilly she had to do to work for Hancock Burger? Which one of the two things was Mateo worried Lilly would not be able to do? Why?

Reflection

In chapters 14 and 15, you are introduced to June Figby. What is your first impression of her?

Chapter 16 Perks

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

bussing—clearing (bussing tubs are plastic containers used to clear dishes) **perks**—bonus/things you get because you work somewhere

Questions

What was one reason Mateo was thankful that he had to help train Lilly?

What did Lilly ask Mateo about the job? What did Mateo tell her?

Reflection

At the end of the chapter the following takes place. Mateo stated, "I heard that June offers the extra food to whoever wants to take some, then she'll take whatever no one wants to a shelter or something. I guess you could take leftover burgers with you. But who wants burgers every night?"

Then Lilly laughed and answered, "Are you kidding? Who wouldn't?" What was the difference between Mateo and Lilly? What does this tell you about Lilly? Discuss.

Chapter 17 Just a Joke

Questions

Levi lets Omar and Mateo know that having the police stop them was just a joke. What was Levi's argument? Why did he think it was okay to do what he did?

Levi's uncle Officer Evans had told Levi that he was blind to race issues. Why was this so hard for Levi to believe?

What did Mateo say that helped Levi understand how he was blind to race issues?

Reflections

Mateo stated as he spoke to Levi: "Doing the right thing is calling it the way it is!" I pointed out what was so hard for so many people to understand. "Let's be different, Levi. What's so wrong with different?" What do you think Mateo was trying to explain? Can you think of examples that support Mateo's point? Are there times when it is not as easy as he makes it sound? Discuss.

At the end of the chapter, Mateo stated: . . . it took Levi calling them badass Mexican jackets for me to feel like I'd made the right call on fabric. Levi wasn't the only one that needed to check his thinking.

What did Mateo realize about himself? Explain.

Chapter 18 Wedding Gig

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

drum kit—the basic drum set

Questions

What had Mateo not told his band members about Rivers helping them with the wedding gig? How did Rivers handle the fact that Mateo had not shared his real reason for being there?

What surprised the Bent Rays when more people showed up for the wedding? What was the band worried about? How did Rita Waxman ease their worries?

Chapter 19 Dance Party

Questions

How did the wedding guests respond to the Bent Rays during the first half of the dance party?

At half time, what did Rivers share with the band about his own thoughts on how they were doing?

Why was Mateo angry with Rivers? How did Rivers use Mateo's anger to get his point across?

Reflection

Mateo stated: I found myself safe in my world. With my eyes closed. What was Mateo protected from when his eyes were closed? Is this a habit you think he can break? What do you think it will take for him to break this habit? Discuss.

Chapter 20 Santana

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

mad—crazy/wild sick—1. awful 2<u>. awesome/cool</u> unified—combined/together

Questions

What song did a young woman want the band to perform? Why was this exciting for Mateo?

How did the audience respond to the band's performance of the song? What role did this response play in Mateo opening his eyes as he sang?

Reflection

After Mateo sang with his eyes open, he stated: *Rivers was wrong about one thing. It was not about me sending a message*. What did Mateo believe instead? Do you agree with Mateo? Explain.

Chapter 21 Just Tired

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

killed it—did very well

Questions

What had Rivers told the band after their wedding gig?

Why did Mateo get so upset when Alma handed him a note from her father?

Reflection

Alma asked Mateo if he was upset with her after he pointed out that it was her own lie to Gavin that made her think he would be at church. Mateo only answered that he was *just tired*. Was Mateo just tired? Was there more to it? Was Mateo's approach to dealing with Alma's world working? Discuss.

Chapter 22 The Note

Question

Mateo did not want to read the note and had planned on throwing it away. Why did he read the note after all?

Reflection

What made Mateo so angry about the note? Did he have a right to be so angry? Explain.

Chapter 23 Do Something!



What did Lilly want Mateo to do? Why did this seem strange to Mateo?

What was it that Mateo finally remembered about Lilly's past? How did Mateo hope to use this to help him with Alma?

Reflections

Mateo had hope that Lilly would help him with Alma, but suddenly Lilly backed off. Why do you think Lilly did not want to talk about it anymore with Mateo?

Lilly stated: "I don't get you, Mateo. Why did you help Zonta, who wasn't your friend? Why won't you do the same for someone who is your friend?" Do you think Lilly had a point? Or was it not that simple? Explain.

Chapter 24 Aldo Santos-Vera

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context: sick—1. awful 2. awesome/cool

Questions

Why did Mateo try to avoid Aldo Santos-Vera?

What did Mr. Santos-Vera share with Mateo that shocked him?

Reflections

How did the new information about who was really hitting Alma change Mateo's situation? What did Alma's father want from Mateo? Was the father's request reasonable?

Mateo stated: I could hear my mother telling me over and over again we help because that is just what we do! But how could I help? Suddenly laying low was no longer enough. But laying low was all I knew how to do. What was Mateo's challenge? What needs to change for Mateo to be able to help Alma and her father? Discuss.

Chapter 25 Uncle Pedro

Check out how these words are used in context:

tamales—seasoned ground meat or beans are wrapped in cornmeal dough and then usually wrapped into corn husks and steamed

Question

What did Mateo learn from his cousin, Angel, about Gavin and college?

Reflection

What role did Uncle Pedro play in Mateo's family? What mood did he set? How do you think Mateo feels about his uncle?

Chapter 26 Bus 51

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context: **dedicated**—loyal, hard working, very focused on something

Question

What did Uncle Pedro share with Mateo about something that happened on his bus in January?

Reflections

This chapter reveals how Mateo felt about his uncle. Describe their relationship. Would you consider this a positive relationship? Explain.

At the end of the chapter Mateo stated: I realized I might have been harder on Blake than I should have been. Not because he lived in public housing, but because I realized maybe I really didn't know him at all. I'd have to think on that one. What did Mateo mean? Do you agree with him? Explain.

Chapter 27 Lyrics

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

groove—style/rhythm that is enjoyed
on cue—just at the right time like it was planned that way
original—a musical piece that has been written by the performers

Questions

What did Rivers suggest Bent Rays do at the Battle-of-the-Bands competition? Why?

What were all the original music pieces by Bent Rays missing?

Reflections

No one on the Bent Rays knew that Mateo wrote lyrics. What does this tell you about Mateo?

What memory of Emma made Mateo say that he would bring his lyrics to share? Do you think Emma had more of an impact on Mateo than he was willing to admit? Explain.

Chapter 28 Slapped

Vocabulary

Check out how these words are used in context:

sick—1. <u>awfu</u>l 2. awesome/cool **suspended**—removed from the school for a specific period of time as a form of punishment

Questions

What noise did Mateo hear coming from the costume closet? Why did Mateo hesitate to step into the closet at first? But why did he finally decide to open the door?

What did Mateo find in the closet? How did Gavin try to explain what Mateo saw?

Reflections

Although Mateo finally stood up to Gavin, he did not feel like he helped at all. Why did his attempt to help not work? Do you think Alma carried some responsibility (she was to blame too)? Or does her statement "BUT I CAN'T SAY ANYTHING!" really show how she was stuck? Discuss.

Mateo struggles with knowing what to do to really help. Do you think there was something else he should have been doing to help? Discuss.

Chapter 29 Crazy

Questions

Mateo asked Lilly about how she dealt with her own bad situation. What was Lilly's response?

What did Lilly point out was the difference between her and Alma?

Reflection

At the end of the chapter, Lilly laughed and told Mateo, "You have no idea how crazy it is that you asked me for help. Funny! Too funny!" Why do you think Lilly thought it was so crazy? Explain.

Reflections

Even though Mateo had pushed Emma and others away as friends, Mateo said to Lilly, "What? I thought we were beginning to be friends?" He then stated: I teased, knowing very well that Lilly would be the one person that would not be calling me a friend any time soon. Why did he make the statement to Lilly? What does this tell you about Mateo and friendships?

Lilly finally stated to Mateo: "The way I see it, if you're so great with creating music, then you're just one creative thought away from helping Alma." Is this a positive statement? Do you think Mateo has it in him to do as Lilly said? Discuss.

Reflection

At the end of the chapter Mateo asked what he could do to stop Gavin. The officer answered: "So find someone who has nothing to lose. Someone who can't be hurt by Gav—the boy." Officer Evans smiled. "Get creative." What did Officer Evans mean by someone who has nothing to lose? What difference do you think that would make if he could find that person? Who do you think might be that person? Discuss.

Questions

Reflection

What did Mateo realize that he had in common with Ozzie? How did Mateo think this might help him? Do you think Ozzie will listen to Mateo? Discuss.

Chapter 39 Upset



Check out how these words are used in context: **ticked at—**angry with

Questions

What did Blake do that made the whole class be quiet? How did the teacher respond?

What did the teacher do that showed the whole class that she was upset with Lilly?

Reflections

As the drama was taking place in the classroom, Mateo stated: As sorry as I felt for Blake, it was that brutal honesty that I counted on. What did he mean by that? What was it about Blake that Mateo suddenly liked and needed?

Although the reason is not stated in this chapter, what reasons do you think the teacher might have for being upset with Lilly? Predict based on your own opinions of Lilly and the life you suspect she lives.

Question

Reflection

Reflection

Questions


